

APPLICATION FOR RE-ADMISSION

Former Warner Pacific College Students who have withdrawn from the College or have failed to maintain continuous enrollment may apply for re-admission. Students who have filed a Leave of Absence Form with the Records Office and return at the prescribed time are not required to apply for re-admission.

The following are required for the re-admission process:

- A completed application for re-admission, including a signed Community Covenant, and a \$50.00 (USD) application fee.
- An official transcript from each college and university attended in the interim sent directly from the institution to the Admissions Office.
- Statement describing the reason you left Warner and why you wish to return.
- Two references from people familiar with the applicant's character and academic background.

COMMUNITY COVENANT

Warner Pacific College exists to develop persons as change agents characterized by integrity, deliberate personal and social transformation, the practice of mutual responsibility, and a pursuit of personal excellence. Development of a community requires open, honest, caring communication, as well as sacrifice and loving adjustment in personal liberties. The Warner Pacific community willingly chooses to adhere to rules for behavior based on biblical principles of healthy living that are designed to promote the welfare of the entire community.

Warner Pacific College extends enrollment privileges to any person who academically qualifies, has the ability to benefit from and contribute to the opportunities offered at the College, and is willing to abide by the behavioral expectations regardless of religion, race, color, sex, gender, sexual orientation (including gender identity), national origin, disability, age, veteran status, and any other status protected by laws and regulations. Warner Pacific College encourages all members of the community to make responsible Christian choices in all decisions. The following specific behavioral expectations have been established for all students enrolled at Warner Pacific while on college property, while involved in college-related activities, or while representing the College in any way.

The College upholds the laws of the local community, the nation, and the state of Oregon. Such laws include prohibitions against possession or use of illegal drugs or drug paraphernalia, against purchasing or consuming alcoholic beverages by persons under the age of 21, drunkenness, and driving under the influence of alcohol.

The College expects our members to abide by New Testament biblical standards that reflect moral sexual behavior.

The College upholds integrity as a core value of the community. Members are expected to take responsibility for their own violations of all behavioral guidelines in and out of the classroom and demonstrate commitment to the value of integrity in word and deed.

The College is committed to providing a learning and work environment free of harassment.

The College recognizes that the use of tobacco products and alcoholic beverages present a danger to personal health. Under no circumstances shall any member of the community use or possess these products on campus, when attending a college-related activity, or representing the College in any way.

The College expects students to abstain from any violent behavior or threats of violence to self or others.

The College expects students to abstain from gambling, profanity, obscenity, vulgar behavior, or any other activity that would disrupt the educational process.

The College expects students to use wisdom and discretion in entertainment choices including television, movies, video games, and Internet sites and avoid those that display sexually explicit nudity, pornography, hate speech, or satanic activities.

Other Rules and Regulations necessary for orderly community life are listed in the student handbook, *The Squire*. Students are responsible for reading and understanding what is listed in *The Squire*. Violations will result in disciplinary action and will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

This agreement should only be signed by those who whole-heartedly support the community lifestyle it outlines.
