Warner Pacific College is pleased to invite you to apply for our 2014-2015 scholarships. These scholarships are available to a limited number of students with outstanding achievement and potential for contribution to Warner Pacific College. As part of this application, two recommendation forms must be submitted to the Office of Enrollment no later than February 1, 2014.

**Applicants for WPC scholarships must complete the WPC admissions application process and be admitted in good standing as a full-time student in the traditional program by February 1, 2014.**

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## Application Process

1. Applicants must complete the admissions application process and be admitted to the traditional program at the College by February 1, 2014.
2. The scholarship application process requires completed essays and recommendation forms. The recommendation forms must be mailed or faxed directly to the Office of Enrollment. All application materials must be received no later than February 1, 2014.
3. Applicants are required to attend the WPC Scholarship Day on February 22, 2014.

Be sure to include Warner Pacific College's school code: **003225**, so that we receive your information.
6. Scholarship notifications will be mailed after March 5, 2014. Financial Aid Award Letters will be mailed to students after March 5, 2014 if your FAFSA is complete and on file with the Office of Student Financial Services.

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## Scholarship Information: (Scholarships requires interview or audition)

### Lee Leadership Award

The Lee Leadership Award is an award of up to \$1,000 named in honor of Henrietta Lee, a long-time supporter of Warner Pacific College. It is available to students demonstrating significant leadership involvement in their church, school and community. Applicants must also possess a desire to actively participate in the Warner Pacific College Student Leadership Program. A limited number of scholarships are awarded each year.

**Eligibility:**

A minimum 2.75 (4.00 scale) cumulative high school GPA or a 2.50 cumulative college GPA is required to apply.

**Renewal:**

The award is renewable for up to three years, provided the recipient actively participates in the Warner Pacific College Leadership Program, maintains a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA, and is enrolled full-time.

### Dr. John Garlington Award

The Dr. John Garlington Award is named in honor of Dr. Garlington and his vision to support students who promote diversity and racial reconciliation on the campus of Warner Pacific College. The Dr. John Garlington Award is an award of up to \$2,500 granted to a limited number of students each year who have demonstrated a significant commitment to diversity in their schools and/or community.

**Eligibility:**

A minimum 2.00 (4.00 scale) cumulative high school GPA or college GPA is required to apply.

**Renewal:**

The award is renewable for up to three years, provided the recipient actively participates in the Student Diversity Council and one additional Multicultural Student Organization on campus, maintains a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA, and is enrolled full-time.

### Act Six Academy Scholarship

The Warner Pacific College Act Six Academy Scholarship is available to students who are leaders in their school and community. Students who receive this \$1,500 scholarship are required to attend weekly leadership training seminars throughout the summer leading to the start of their first year at Warner Pacific College. Students are provided a mentor/coach to work with them to prepare for their transition to the college environment and to ready them for being leaders in the classroom and in community activities from the first day of school. Since participation in the weekly training is required, awards are limited to students living in the Portland metro area (within easily commutable distance of campus).

**Eligibility:**

A minimum 2.75 (4.00 scale) cumulative high school GPA and demonstrated leadership qualities are required to apply.

**Renewal:**

The award is renewable for up to three years, provided the recipient actively participates in the Act Six Academy leadership training program & campus activities, maintains a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA, and is enrolled full-time.

### Music Award

The Warner Pacific College Music Award is available to a limited number of students with outstanding abilities and interest in music. The amount of the award varies based on the ability and level of commitment of the recipient.

**Eligibility:**

A minimum 2.50 (4.00 scale) cumulative high school GPA or a 2.00 cumulative college GPA is required to apply. During auditions, an art song or aria (vocalists) or a sonata movement (instrumentalists) is to be presented. A second selection of a more vernacular nature, such as a Broadway or jazz tune, is welcome.

**Renewal:**

The award is variable and renewable for up to three years provided the recipient successfully re-auditions, actively participates in the Music Program with a positive attitude, maintains a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA, and is enrolled full-time.

### Theatre Award

The Warner Pacific College Theatre Award is a competitive award and is available to a limited number of students who exhibit a strong interest in and commitment to the dramatic arts. The amount of the award varies based on the recipient's abilities, growth, and level of commitment. Students who have not yet declared or committed to a minor in Drama can still be considered for this scholarship.

**Eligibility:**

A minimum of a 2.50 (4.00 scale) cumulative high school GPA or a 2.00 cumulative college GPA is required to apply. Applicants interested in acting and directing will present a memorized monologue, one to two minutes in length, and may be asked to read from a script made available at the audition. Applicants interested in acting, directing, stage management, design, and theatre technology will participate in an interview. Management, design, and tech may present prompt books and portfolios at this time.

**Renewal:**

The award is variable and renewable for up to three years provided the recipient actively participates in Theatre Practicum, campus productions, and Theatre-related activities; maintains a minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA, and is enrolled full-time.
