

## WPU Enrollment and Aid Eligibility

Below is a summary of the types of federal aid a student may receive at Warner Pacific University. **Eligibility is based on criteria regulated by the U.S. Department of Education.** See <https://studentaid.gov/understand-aid/types>. Aid may be adjusted if enrollment status changes before the last day to drop a course without earning a W (withdrawal) grade.

<p><b>Federal Work-Study</b>  [Traditional and PGS Students Seeking First Associate or Bachelor's Degree]</p>	<p>Student will awarded 100% of award amount determined by the school for an academic year or a reduced amount if student does not need.</p>	<p>Not eligible</p>
<p><b>Federal Parent PLUS Loan</b></p>	<p>Parents of dependent traditional and ADP students may apply. <b>Student must file a FAFSA.</b></p>	<p>Parent not eligible</p>
<p><b>Federal TEACH Grant</b>  [Traditional and PGS Students]</p> <p>FAFSA,TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve (ATS), and TEACH Grant Initial and Subsequent Counseling required</p>	<p>Contact the Office of Student Financial Services with eligibility questions. <p><b>Oregon Opportunity Grant</b>  [Traditional and PGS Students]</p> <p>FAFSA required or Oregon Student Aid Application (ORSAA) for students ineligible to file the FAFSA</p>	<p>Oregon residents as determined by the FAFSA or ORSAA may receive Oregon Opportunity Grant if enrolled full time or half time. Student must receive a fall disbursement to qualify for a spring disbursement.</p>	<p>Not eligible</p>
<p><b>Warner Pacific Aid</b>  [Traditional Full Time Students]</p>	<p>Traditional, full time students may be eligible for Warner Pacific institutional aid. **WPU Federal Aid Eligibility for Other Degrees:**

<b>Graduate Degrees</b> [Traditional and PGS Students]	Admitted to Warner Pacific as a regular student in a graduate program.	Students may be eligible for Federal Unsubsidized loans and Graduate PLUS loan if they qualify (refer to <a href="https://studentaid.gov/understand-aid/types">https://studentaid.gov/understand-aid/types</a> ). Students admitted to the Masters in Teaching program may qualify for a TEACH grant.  FAFSA required (and TEACH Grant applications if MAT student)
<b>Second Undergrad Degree</b> [Traditional and PGS Students]	Students working on a second bachelor's degree after earning a first undergraduate degree	If eligible, student may receive Federal Stafford loans only.  FAFSA required
