



## Warner Pacific University General Education Core Requirements for Transfer Students- General Overview

The following chart provides a general overview of core requirements at Warner Pacific University (WPU). The WPU Records Office will evaluate your transcript to make a final determination regarding applicability of your transfer courses.

All core courses must be completed at the college level with a grade of C- or higher. Any one course may be applied toward only one area of general education core. Vocational/technical credits may not be applied toward Core Studies requirements.

Warner Pacific University Core Requirement	Standard Transfer Course Equivalency	Credits
<b>Exploration of Spiritual Journey</b> Take REL-220 or REL-320 at WPU	No transfer equivalency.	n/a
<b>Holistic World View</b>	Option A: Bible-based Christian studies course. <i>or</i> Option B: Health theory course PLUS a physical education activity course.	3
<b>Ethics / Ethical Worldview</b>	Any ethics course.	3
<b>Appreciation of Diversity</b>	Humanities or social science course with a focus on diversity or global issues. Examples include Cultural Anthropology, World Religions, Racial & Ethnic Relations, and foreign languages.	3
<b>Urban Life</b>	Social science course with a focus on human behavior, social interactions, and/or urban issues. Examples include General Psychology, Sociology, American Government, and Urban Studies.	3
<b>Written Communication</b> (2 course sequence)	Two-course college writing sequence, including an introduction to essay and research writing. Remedial coursework does not apply.	6
<b>Advanced Information Literacy and Research</b> Met by ILR-300 at WPU	Any <u>upper-division</u> course with a focus on advanced literacy, research, and writing skills.	3
<b>Interdisciplinary Thinking</b> Take HUM-310 or HUM-410 at WPU	No transfer equivalency.	n/a
<b>Information Technology</b>	Any course focused on the use of technology. Examples include Intro to Computers, Microsoft Office, Web Design, and Digital Media.	3
<b>Scientific Reasoning / Knowledge</b>	Any college-level course from the biological or physical sciences. Examples include biology, chemistry, environmental science, and physics.	3
<b>Quantitative Reasoning</b>	Any college-level mathematics course. Remedial coursework does not apply.	3
<b>Historical/Cultural Knowledge and Practice</b>	Any course from exploring historical context or artistic expression. Examples include History, Fine Art, Music, Drama, and Literature.	3
<b>Critical Thinking and Strategic Action</b>	Any course focused on the use of critical thinking or purposeful dialogue. Examples include Communication, Economics, and Philosophy.	3



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### COMMUNITY COLLEGE DEGREE/TRANSFER INFORMATION:

**OREGON: Associate of Art Oregon Transfer Degree (AAOT) and Associate of Science Oregon Transfer Degree (ASOT)** – The AAOT and ASOT degrees will be accepted as having met all core studies requirements except for the three advanced-level core course requirements (REL 220 or 320, ILR 300, and HUM 310 or 410).

**WASHINGTON: Associate of Arts/Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA)** – The degree will be accepted as having met all core studies requirements except for the three advanced-level core course requirements (REL 220 or 320, ILR 300, and HUM 310 or 410).

**Other Associate Degree** – Completion of another associate degree (such as the AS, AST, AAS, AAST, or AGS) does not guarantee fulfillment of all lower division Core Studies requirements for a Warner Pacific baccalaureate degree. The transcript will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis using course equivalency chart. Having completed an associate degree does qualify a student to be admitted with junior status. The student should work with an Academic Advisor to plan for transfer to the school and major of their choice.

**Transfer without a Degree** – Students may elect to earn credits and transfer to Warner Pacific without earning an associate degree. Please meet with an Academic Advisor for an individualized plan of study.
