Transfer Guide for Mt Hood Community College

Warner Pacific University is committed to serving students by providing clear pathways for baccalaureate degree completion. The degree completion program is designed with working professionals in mind. This one night a week, accelerated adult degree program empowers you to earn your bachelor's degree while balancing your life and work.

Courses You Should Take at Mt Hood Community College (48 semester credits)

Complete at least 72 quarter credits (48 semester credits) of transferrable coursework.

Meet the lower-division general education core through one of these options.

Option 1: Complete the AAOT to meet the general education core

OR

Option 2: Complete the specific general education core course requirements (grades of C- or higher) as follows:

- Written Communication (2 courses)
- Information Technology (1 course)
- Science (1 course)
- Mathematics (1 course)
- Hist/Cultural Knowledge (1 course)
- Critical Thinking & Strategic Action (1 course)
- Holistic Worldview (1 Health Course + 1 PE Course)
- Ethics (1 course)
- Appreciation of Diversity (1 course)
- Urban Life (1 course)

Elective Credit (29 semester credits)

Complete an additional 29 semester credits to reach 120 total semester credits for the bachelor's degree. You have flexibility in selecting your elective credit. If you have already earned additional transfer credit, you can use it here.

Other options for earning credit include the following:

- Taking additional credit or a minor at WPU
- Completing additional elective coursework at your community college
- Earning credit by examination
- Submitting professional certificates and workforce training for prior learning assessment.
