DUTIES

Position Description:

Compassion Youth Mentoring (CYM) brings together local churches and individuals to prevent the sexual exploitation of children through after school mentoring groups that take place all over the Portland metro area. For CYM groups to run smoothly, volunteers and mentors need to be well-supported and equipped. This position will support mentors and volunteers through assisting in planning and coordinating weekly activities and curriculum. The curriculum coordinator will work with a specific CYM group and its mentors to help plan activities (crafts, food, discussions, etc.) and create helpful tools to keep track of weekly plans.

Key Responsibilities/ Projects

- Function as small project director and/or support in the areas of:
- Attending specific CYM groups to get a feel for what the youth enjoy, which will help in researching and planning
 activities
- Looking through existing CYM resources/curriculum and researching new ideas to develop plans for CYM group activities
- Researching, creating, or utilizing pre-existing tools (calendars/weekly schedules) to implement for mentors and volunteers to keep track of what they are doing
- · Coordinating with and assisting mentors and volunteers to make plans for each week
