

# B.S. in Finance and Accounting (double major)

## Warner Pacific University 2-Year Degree Plan



This sample curriculum is designed to show you how a program may be constructed for the junior-standing transfer student to complete the major in 2 years. **This plan assumes you have successfully completed the following college-level coursework that has been approved for transfer to WPU:**

- **At least 60 semester credits of transfer credit**
- **All lower-division core requirements** for Warner Pacific University through one of the following options:
  - Successful completion of an Associate of Arts for Oregon Transfer (AAOT) degree
  - Successful completion of a Washington Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) associate degree
  - Successful completion of all required individual courses for lower-division core
- **Introduction to Business course** with a grade of C- or higher
- **Financial Accounting course** with a grade of C- or higher, completed within the past 5 years
- **Managerial Accounting course** with a grade of C- or higher, completed within the past 5 years
- **Microsoft Office course including coverage of Excel spreadsheets** with a grade of C- or higher
- **College Algebra or Statistics course** with a grade of C- or higher
- **Marketing course** with a grade of C- or higher
- **Microeconomics and Macroeconomics sequence** with a grade of C- or higher
- **Business Communication course** with a grade of C- or higher

Completion of this double major requires significant coursework. If you desire to complete your studies in two years at WPU, you will need to plan carefully in advance and transfer all of the above coursework to WPU. You will also need to take a very full course load each semester at WPU and complete your internship in the summer. **If you lack any of these requirements, you will need to add them to your degree plan** and you may require more than 2 years for completion. You should work with your academic advisor to design a personalized program of studies.
