Transfer Guide for Clark College



Transfer Associate Degrees: The DTA (Associate of Arts/Direct Transfer Agreement) degree will be accepted as having met all lower-division core studies requirements for a baccalaureate degree. Students will still take the three advanced-level core requirements (REL 320, ILR 300, and HUM 310) after transferring to Warner Pacific University.

Other Associate Degrees or Transfer without a Degree: Students who transfer with another associate degree (such as the AS, AST, AAS, AAST, or AGS) or who transfer without a degree will have their transcript evaluated on a course-by-course basis for using the general education core course equivalency chart.

General Education Core Course Transfer Equivalency Chart

All core courses must be completed at the college level with a grade of C- or higher. Any one course may be applied toward only one area of the core. Vocational/technical credits may not be applied toward core.

Healthy Lifestyle (1 Health + 1 PE course)	HPE 258, HPE 266, HLTH 100, 101, 104, 207, 208 or NUTR 101 PLUS One activity course from Physical Education (PE, PEDNC, or PEMAR)	3 credit minimum
Ethics (1 course)	ENGL 273, PHIL 240, or PHIL 251	3 credit minimum
Appreciation of Diversity (1 course)	ANTH 206, ASL 125, CMST 216, ENGL 175, ENGL 254, GEOG 102, SOC 131, WS 101-225 or any foreign language course (ASL, JAPN, or SPAN)	3 credit minimum
Urban Life (1 course)	PEEXS 294, POLS 111, POLS 131, PSYC 100, PSYC 203, or SOC 101	3 credit minimum
Foundations of Christian Faith (1 course)	No equivalent course. <i>Note: This requirement may be waived for students who transfer to WPU with junior-level class standing.</i>	

General Education Core Courses Completed at Warner Pacific University

All students will complete 3 advanced-level general education core courses at WPU: ILR 300 Advanced Information Literacy & Research, HUM 310 Exploring the Human Condition, and REL 320: Spirituality, Character, and Service.
