## Warner Pacific University General Education Core Transfer Guide



**Transfer Associate Degrees:** The AAOT (Associate of Art Oregon Transfer Degree), ASOT (Associate of Science Oregon Transfer Degree), and the DTA (Washington Associate of Arts/Direct Transfer Agreement) degrees will be accepted as having met all lower-division core studies requirements for a baccalaureate degree. Students will still take the three advanced-level core requirements (REL 320, ILR 300, and HUM 310) after transferring to Warner Pacific University.

Other Associate Degrees or Transfer without a Degree: Students who transfer with another associate degree (such as the AS, AST, AAS, AAST, or AGS) or who transfer without a degree will have their transcript evaluated on a course-by-course basis for using the general education core course equivalency chart.

## **General Education Core Course Transfer Equivalency Chart**

All core courses must be completed at the college level with a grade of C- or higher. Any <u>one</u> course may be applied toward only <u>one</u> area of the core. Vocational/technical credits may not be applied toward core.

Warner Pacific University Core Requirement	Standard Transfer Course Equivalency	Semester Credits
Written Communication (2 course sequence)	Two-course college writing sequence, including an introduction to essay and research writing. Remedial coursework does not apply.	6
Information Technology (1 course)	Any course focused on the use of technology. Examples include Intro to Computers, Microsoft Office, Web Design, and Digital Media.	3
Science (1 course)	Any college-level course from the biological or physical sciences. Examples include biology, chemistry, environmental science, and physics.	3
Mathematics (1 course)	Any college-level mathematics course. Remedial coursework does not apply.	3
Historical & Cultural Knowledge (1 course)	Any course from exploring historical context or artistic expression. Examples include History, Fine Art, Music, Drama, and Literature.	3
Critical Thinking & Strategic Action (1 course)	Any course focused on the use of critical thinking or purposeful dialogue. Examples include Communication, Economics, and Philosophy.	3
Healthy Lifestyle (1 Health + 1 PE course)	Health theory course PLUS a physical education activity course.	3
Ethics (1 course)	Any ethics course.	3
Appreciation of Diversity (1 course)	Humanities or social science course with a focus on diversity or global issues. Examples include Cultural Anthropology, World Religions, Racial & Ethnic Relations, and foreign languages.	3
Urban Life (1 course)	Social science course with a focus on human behavior, social interactions, and/or urban issues. Examples include General Psychology, Sociology, American Government, and Urban Studies.	3
Foundations of Christian Faith (1 course)	A Bible-based Christian studies course.  Note: This requirement may be waived for students who transfer to WPU with junior-level class standing.	3

## **General Education Core Courses Completed at Warner Pacific University**

All students will complete 3 advanced-level general education core courses at WPU: ILR 300 Adv Information Literacy & Research (3), HUM 310 Exploring the Human Condition (3), and REL 320: Spirituality, Character, & Service (3).
