Pre-Medicine Track

The Warner Pacific Pre-Medicine Track allows for students to complete their prerequisite coursework, earn a baccalaureate degree, and obtain assistance with the medical school preparation, selection, and application process. Students who enter this track are seeking to become allopathic physicians (MDs) or osteopathic physicians (DOs). Becoming a physician is a rigorous process that requires multiple years of study. Given the emphasis on biomedical sciences and requirement of a pre-entrance test, the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT), this track is ideal for students who are declared as Biological Sciences: Human Biology Emphasis majors.

Warner Pacific University Pre-Medicine Track

Students must complete a bachelor's degree including a specific set of prerequisite courses, before matriculating to a professional school to earn their Doctorate of Medicine (MD) or Doctorate of Osteopathic Medicine (DO) degree. Students on this track select to complete their bachelor's degree prior to matriculation, which is required. The requirements in this pre-professional track meet prerequisite requirements of local medical school programs including Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU) in Portland, Oregon, and Western University of Health Sciences in Lebanon, Oregon. Students are responsible for researching requirements at the schools in which they are interested and adding any necessary extra coursework.

In addition to completing the courses listed below, Pre-Medicine Track students complete the requirements for a major as well as other graduation requirements. Majors highly compatible with this track (meaning there is ample course crossover) include Biological Sciences. This track can be applied to any traditional undergraduate major.
