## **Pre-Pharmacy Track**

The Warner Pacific Pre-Pharmacy Track allows for students to complete their prerequisite coursework, earn a baccalaureate degree, and obtain assistance with the pharmacy school preparation, selection, and application process.

Students who enter this track are seeking to become pharmacists. Pharmacists are health care professionals licensed to prescribe medications and are highly educated about drug actions and interactions. Given the emphasis on biomedical sciences, this track is ideal for students who are Biological Sciences: Human Biology Emphasis majors.

## Warner Pacific University Pre-Pharmacy Track

Students must complete a bachelor's degree including a specific set of prerequisite courses, before matriculating to a professional school to earn their Doctor of Pharmacy degree. Students on this track select to complete their bachelor's degree prior to matriculation, which is required. The requirements in this pre-professional track meet prerequisite requirements of local pharmacy programs including Pacific University and Oregon State University in Oregon. Students are responsible for researching requirements at the schools in which they are interested and adding any necessary extra coursework.

In addition to completing the courses listed below, Pre-Pharmacy Track students complete the requirements for a major as well as other graduation requirements. Majors highly compatible with this track (meaning there is ample course crossover) include Biological Sciences. This track can be applied to any traditional undergraduate major.
