Courses at Mt Hood Community College (48 semester credits)

Complete at least 72 quarter credits (48 semester credits) of transferrable coursework.

Meet the Business Administration major prerequisites

- o Take BA 131
- o Take MTH 111

Meet the lower-division general education core through one of these options.

Option 1: Complete the AAOT to meet the general education core

OR

Option 2: Complete the specific general education core course requirements (grades of C- or higher) as follows:

- Written Communication (2 courses)
- Information Technology (Met by BA 131)
- o Science (1 course)
- Mathematics (Met by MTH 111)
- Hist/Cultural Knowledge (1 course)
- Critical Thinking & Strategic Action (1 course)
- o Holistic Worldview (1 Health Course + 1 PE Course)
- o Ethics (1 course)
- Appreciation of Diversity (1 course)
- o Urban Life (1 course)

Warner Pacific University Courses (45-51 semester credits)

WPU offers multiple options within the Business program, including the following:

- BA in Business Administration
- BA in Business Administration, Emphasis in Health Care Administration
- BA in Business Administration, Emphasis in Human Resource Management

Your WPU advisor will work with you to design a personalized plan and class schedule to complete your bachelor's degree.

Elective Credit (21-27 semester credits)

Complete an additional 21-27 semester credits to reach 120 total semester credits for the bachelor's degree. You have flexibility in selecting your elective credit. If you have already earned additional transfer credit, you can use it here.

Other options for earning credit include the following:

- Taking additional credit or a minor at WPU
- Completing additional elective coursework at your community college
- Earning credit by examination
- Submitting professional certificates and workforce training for prior learning assessment.
