Maintaining Good Standing in the Nursing Program

In order to maintain good standing and eligibility to earn a BSN Degree, students who have been admitted to the Nursing Major must:

- Maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or higher and a minimum GPA of 2.5 in Nursing courses. Each course in the major must be passed with a minimum grade of C-.
- Declare and document any subsequent reportable behavior (as gathered in a background check) after program admission.

Initial Licensure

Generalist BSN-prepared graduates are eligible to take the NCLEX-RN. Upon passing, the selected State Board of Nursing reviews applications and issues licenses.
