If you lack any of these requirements, you will need to add them to your degree plan and may require more than 2.5 years for completion. You should work with your academic advisor to design a personalized program of studies.

This program includes multiple courses that are offered every 2 years on a rotating basis. Course offerings will vary depending on the date of your entry into the program.
