DUTIES

The Extended Day Instructor will work with the SUN Site Supervisor and Extended Day Coordinator to provide opportunities for enrichment classes and activities after school. Specific duties include building rapport with students, supporting with behavior management, tutoring students as needed and engaging in play with students when homework is done and students switch to free time.
